Psalm 72:1-4 (Of Solomon.):

¹Give the king your justice, O God, and your righteousness to the royal son!

² May he judge your people with righteourness, and your poor with justice!

³ Let the mountains bear prosperity for the people, and the hills, in righteousness!

⁴ May he defend the cause of the poor of the people, give deliverance to the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor!

God's Justice

Justice is never an easy term to define. Of course you could go to the internet a do a Google search for the definition, but the answers you find only provoke further speculation since most definitions end up using words like fairness, merit, or equality, all of which raise the question of who gets to decide what fairness, merit, or equality looks like. In Psalm 72, God is the source of justice, and confessing that God is the source of justice runs contrary to many of our preconceptions of what justice is. Here is one example.

Justice as it comes from God is connected to God's authority and His ability to render judgments. We tend to think of justice as measured outcomes, as when we ask ourselves, "Did we or someone else get what we or they deserve?" God does care about outcomes, but His authority as Creator expands His judgments to include His ruling and reigning over everything. Therefore, God is certainly exercising His justice when He pronounces the world guilty of sin (Romans 3:23; Eccl. 7:20; 1 John 1:8) and when He judges people's hearts and motives (Mark 15:8; Isaiah 29:13). But God does not make the modern distinction between judicial, executive, and legislative judgments and thus justice, so God is exercising His justice when He, by His providence, upholds creation (Hebrews 1:3) and assures us of our access to creation in ways we take for granted (the sun rising every morning, the growth of plants and animals for food, etc.). Very often, we question God's justice because of a particular outcome we think we deserve while forgetting that the abundance of blessings we receive daily without a second thought are every bit as much a part of God's justice as the measured outcome we desire in a particular situation.

In Isaiah 51:4, God says, "I will set my justice for a light to the peoples." When we pray the Lord's Prayer, we pray, "Thy kingdom come," and when we pray that petition, we're praying that God's kingdom as revealed and inaugurated by Jesus would rule and reign among us. Essentially, we're praying that the fullness of God's justice as exemplified in the cross and empty tomb be brought to bear upon our church, our families, and our individual lives. In Christ, the light of God's justice is the light of Christ's atonement for our sins. It's the light of justification whereby through Jesus paying the price for our sins, we become justified by grace through faith instead of the outcomes of our ability to keep God's commands (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Jesus' incarnation, death, and resurrection as the Son of the Living God encapsulates every aspect of God's ruling and reigning along with the justice and judgments such action entails. This makes the comfort of the Gospel go much deeper than questions about our individual desires for favorable outcomes. God cares about these outcomes, but He does so within the context of His authority over all creation and His desire to save a fallen people situated within a fallen universe.

"Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law" (Romans 13:8).

When we incur a debt, whatever that debt may be, we repay it according to the instruction given in Psalm 37:21— "The wicked borrow and do not repay, but the righteous give generously."

This motivation arises from the debt that can never be marked as "paid in full," the debt of love. God so loved us that He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, who in love met our deepest needs. In Christ's love, we serve and do not sin against our neighbor, which may harm him and bring the condemnation of the Law. A new series for a new year! What is a child?


