Poverty: The Idea versus the Reality

In Psalm 41:1, King David will begin by writing, "Blessed is the one who considers the poor!" The authors of the Lutheran Study Bible will note how in this verse, "As king, David is to defend the powerless" (TLSB 886). You and I typically think of poverty only in economic terms, and while poverty includes a lack of money and resources, it goes much deeper. The people of Israel, for example, were powerless when they were slaves in Egypt, and this powerlessness applied not only to their economic position but also their inability to worship God the way they desired. In fact, when Moses and Aaron first approach Pharaoh about letting God's people go, they ask only that Pharaoh allow the people to go into the wilderness to hold a feast to God (Exodus 5:1).

In the case of Moses, the people of Israel, and Pharaoh, we know how the account goes. God hears the cries of powerlessness (poverty) arising from His people and frees them, so He can lead them to the promised land. Yet, what happens when they are in the wilderness? They realize that their ideas of freedom look considerably different than the reality of freedom. The reality of freedom meant trusting God's care and provision and following God's lead. It meant relying on Him instead of the routines and conveniences to which they were accustomed. The Israelites liked the idea of freedom but were much less enamored with the reality.

We too struggle with the difference between the idea of something and the reality. We like the idea of having a Savior who loves us unconditionally and who dies and rises, so we can have eternal life. We like that idea, but we are not as comfortable with the powerlessness such salvation entails. Like with the Israelites, we are called to trust God's care and provision and follow His lead, but also like the Israelites, we find ourselves grumbling because our ideas of following Jesus look different than the reality of picking up our crosses and following Him (Matthew 16:24-28).

One point the Exodus narrative illustrates is God's faithfulness in the face of our faltering trust. Reality is not determined by our ideas but by God's steadfast love, and this reality is fully disclosed in Jesus and delivered to us in Word and Sacrament. Jesus, like David in Psalm 41, will start with poverty in the Sermon on the Mount, where He will proclaim, "Blessed are the poor in spirit" (Matthew. 5:3). We are powerless, including powerless to believe in God, but through Christ, God has made our poverty the blessings of His mercy and resurrection life, and so we cling to this reality regardless of what other ideas we may have.


