Thanksgiving for Witness

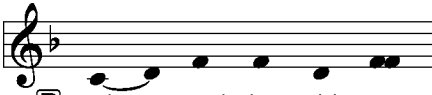

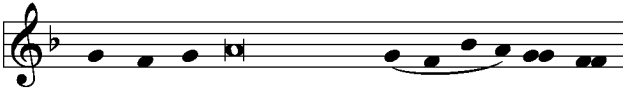


