4.	What the <i>really real stuff</i> of the universe is turns out to be, which is to say This universe turns out to be a meaningful place, but it's only meaningful according to God's Word (that is Jesus), not ours.
5.	Because Jesus is the Word, "who we are" (our identity) will not be determined by other people's words, by our feelings, by science, or by our personal preferences. Who we are will be determined by our relationship to his Man, the Word in the Flesh—Jesus. Read John 14:6.

10	. Idols deceive the idol worshiper by creating a false story that promises a happy ending. This false story hides the idol behind a veil or camouflage of goodness.
11	. The picture painted for you by your idol becomes the source of your righteousness—that is—it tells you the way things are supposed to be, and you begin to measure the people and circumstances around you (their righteousness) based on the sinful righteousness of your idol. Isaiah 35:8-10. "Gives you a Way" example (goal/means analysis).
12	. Whatever you call "the best" in your life is probably where you are most susceptible to idolatry.
13	. Idols, Stories, Happy Endings, and FoMO—Fof MO Give an example where you've seen others go through FoMO.
14	. Read Galatians 5:22-24. How does Christ's death and resurrection eliminate FoMO? Why does the Spirit of Christ never produce the fruit of idolatry?
15	. Believing. Belonging. Behaving.
