Refuge and Vows

Psalm 61:5, "For you, O God, have heard my vows; you have given me the heritage of those who fear your name."

The authors of the Bible use many different words to characterize God's relationship to us and then our relationship to Him. In Psalm 61, King David will begin by writing of God as a "refuge, a strong tower against the enemy" (61:3). A refuge is a place of safety amid turmoil, war, and destruction. The reason David can confess God as a His refuge is because he knew of God's faithfulness in delivering His people. God had been a refuge to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. He had been a refuge to Joseph and his brothers. He had been a refuge to Moses and the people of Israel during their years in Egypt and their sin laden time wandering in the wilderness. In addition, God had been a constant source of deliverance for David himself. The Lord showed Himself to be a reliable refuge, a Lord who kept His promises and kept His people safe.

So, how does David respond to His Lord's faithfulness? By making vows. At first glance, making vows may seem alien to us, but such a response is not as odd as it might first seem. Many remember the "Pledge of Allegiance." What is this but a vow. In marriage, husband and wife make vows of faithfulness and fidelity. Though it is hard for us to believe, you and I are in a better position to make vows to the Lord than King David because you and I have God's revelation of His full deliv-

erance in Jesus.

We call the inside of our church the sanctuary because in church we receive forgiveness, life, and salvation in Word and Sacrament. Through Christ, God reconciles us to Himself and grants us new life in the haven of His grace. In response to these wonderful gifts provided to the Church through Christ, we respond by making vows—baptismal vows and confirmation vows. We do so in deep reverence and recognition that God is God, and we are not; in deep reverence and recognition that God's mercy to us in Jesus is undeserved and yet infinitely valuable. These vows are not to be taken lightly and should reflect gratitude and loyalty to a God who persistently upholds us. Because we are redeemed, forgiven, and secure in the refuge of Christ's love, we should respond the way King David does in the last stanza of Psalm 61, "So will I ever sing praises to your name, as I perform my vows day after day" (Psalm 61:8).

David reminds us that no one or nothing deserves as much loyalty as our Heavenly Father because no one or nothing has done so much to provide us with refuge. Take time to evaluate the loyalties in the life God has given you. Do they reflect the vows you've taken or is there room for repentance and a prayer asking the Holy Spirit to increase your sense of loyalty in response to what

Christ has done for you?

Church Council Meeting St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran Church July 19, 2021

The opening devotion was led by Larry Jung.

The rural Gospel Initiative (RGI) was invited in to give a presentation. The main goals of the RGI is to support ministry staffing efforts, ministries to college students, support workshops and training as well as facilitate ideas that will preserve Gods Kingdom. More information can be made available upon request.

The minutes of the June 21' 2021 meeting were reviewed and approved with a motion by Steve Jacobson and a second by Tom Agnitsch.

The treasurers report was reviewed and approved with a motion from Nate Bode and a second by Jason Oberfoell.

The Board minutes were reviewed and it was noted by Nate Bode that there was a long list of members that need to be reviewed because of moving. The elders will be making calls from the list and either updating information or removing the names from membership. The Board minutes were approved with a motion by Deb Pederson and a second by Paul Swanson.

Pastor reported that the church is going to move forward with the calling of Ray Anderson and presented a handout about the calling process. He requested that the council read through the handout and come up with questions for a later date. Pastor also reported that on the first Sunday of every month the church will be holding a Matins service.

The church received a request for synodical nominations and Nate Bode made a motion not to submit any nominations based on not having enough knowledge of potential nominees. The motion was approved with a second by Steve Jacobson.

The council agreed to schedule the Retreat/Planning for the new Structure and Governance on August 21, 2021 starting at 4PM.

The church was notified that a renewal was coming due for the copy machine in the office. Nate Bode made a motion to not renew the lease, but rather to get multiple bids to ensure that the church is getting the best deal. The motion was approved with a second from Jason Oberfoell.

At a previous meeting it was voted to order a camera security system from Simplisafe. The cameras arrived and were not what was expected so they were returned. A bid was received from Pauer Sound but was a lot higher in cost and more extensive of a system that was needed. It was a recommendation to look into a Blink Camera system as they are affordable and completely wireless. This information will be passed on to Nate Collins. A final bid of approximately \$2700 was also received for new gutters on the preschool. Based on other projects and expenses a motion was made by Nate Bode to table for a later date.


