Church Council Meeting St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran Church August 16, 2021

Larry Jung opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes of the July 19, 2021 Church Council Meeting were reviewed and approved with a motion by Jon Mesmer and a second by Steve Jacobson.

Taylor reported that the church is fiscally ahead of where we were last year in regards to income and expenses. Larry proposed to look at the Treasurers report in more detail and wait for approval at the next council meeting.

The Board Minutes were reviewed and approved with a motion from Deb Pederson and a second by Jon Mesmer.

Pastor reviewed the agenda for the structure and governance retreat this Saturday and discussed what some of the goals of the retreat are. He also presented a handout for a rough draft of a joint parish agreement with St Paul's, Leola. This would essentially allow St Paul's Aberdeen to call Ray Anderson as an Assistant Pastor in Rural Missions after his schooling is complete. If approved by the council, the next step would be for leadership of both parishes to get together and finalize a Joint Parish Agreement. A motion to move forward with the agreement was made by Nate Bode with a second by Tom Agnitsch.

The church is up for renewal on the Stewardship Readings that we receive. After discussion it was decided that the stewardship readings could be generated within the church. Nate B made a motion to not renew the stewardship reading subscriptions with a second by Steve Jacobson.

Larry presented a proposal from Dakota Structured Cabling for a new wireless system in the church. It was recommended to get another proposal from NVC to compare costs.

Paul reported about the flooring for the preschool and how it would be quite expensive to replace. After discussion it was decided that it was not a top priority at this time but we need to start preparing to be able to replace it in the future.

Paul Swanson made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second from Steve Jacobson. The next council meeting is scheduled for September 20, 2021 at 7:00 pm.

As we look towards the beginning of this school year and the new beginnings that await us, we pray for all our students from last year that are beginning Kindergarten and are no longer with us.


