### Called by Christ to Serve as Parents

Deuteronomy 6:4-9

"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

Raising children is not easy. If you have a newborn, you have to wake up at all hours during the night. As they get older you must get them to and from school, games and practices, music lessons, and after a long day of work you have to help them with their homework. On top all of that you still must cook, clean, do laundry, yardwork, and everything else. Having and raising kids is not an easy task and some days can simply be exhausting. Yet, you do all of this because you love your kids and want the best for them.

The Bible has many passages talking to parents about how to raise their kids. Simply google "what does the Bible say about a parent's responsibility" and you will get a whole list of Bible passages. However, the most important aspect of being a parent is captured in this passage from Deuteronomy. Parents above all else are to teach their children all that God has commanded his people.

This naturally means bringing kids to church, but we all know how that goes sometimes. It can be hassle just getting them dressed and ready to go. Not to mention when you get to church, and they begin to cry, scream, and do whatever else kids do. It can feel like a burden, that everyone is watching you struggle, or that you are disrupting service. But nothing could be further from the truth! Even as you struggle, be encouraged knowing that you are doing what you are called to do as parents! That being bringing and raising your kids in church. As pastors we love nothing more than seeing families with their kids there. We know the struggle that parents go through during a church service but what a testament it is, not only to us, but to the church of what it means to be a parent. It means raising your kids by bringing them to church even if you have to do it with them kicking and screaming. Why? Because you want nothing but the best for your kids and because you are called by Christ to serve as parents.

However, raising kids in the faith does not only lie with the parents but also with the church. We, as the church, are called to help parents with kids whenever we can. When we see parents struggle in church, we lend a helping hand instead of getting frustrated with them and their kids. It means we encourage parents to continue to come whenever they can. Raising kids in the faith is the most important aspect of being a parent, but it does not fall on the parents alone, but on the church of all believers as well. We are called to serve those around us and that includes helping those who are called to be parents.

So, parents as you raise your children, remember that above all else you are called by Christ to raise them in faith. To bring them to church, Sunday school, confirmation, and the like. However, you are not alone as you do this for the church at large is also called to help raise your kids in the faith. Raising kids in the faith is not for parents or grandparents alone but for everyone in the church. May we continue to do so, not for our sake, but for the sake of our children and their faith!

# October was Fire-safety month!




October was a very busy month! We made cookies to celebrate learning the letter "C."


