Calling, Serving, and Unity: How Compartmentalization Impacts the Lives of the Saints at St. Paul's

A good place for us to start in considering the future direction of St. Paul's is to begin with St. Paul himself and his letter to the Ephesians. One of the main themes of this letter is unity, and we see this theme very explicitly in the following words from Ephesians 4:1-7;11-16:

"¹I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the *calling* to which you have been *called*, ²with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³eager to maintain *the unity* of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴There is *one body* and *one Spirit*—just as you were called to the *one hope* that belongs to your *call*— ⁵one Lord, *one faith*, *one baptism*, ⁶one *God* and *Father of all*, who is over all and through all and in all. ⁷But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. [...]

¹¹And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹²to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³until we all attain to the *unity of the faith* and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, ¹⁴so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. ¹⁵Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶from whom the *whole body*, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes *the body grow* so that it builds itself up in love."

I highlighted and italicized the many places St. Paul focuses on how we are first *called* but then how we are called *not* into some individualistic or self-interested endeavor but into the body of Christ, into the unity of our faith and Baptism.

Psychologists have a term they use to describe how modern people deal with the lack of unity they have in their life. The term is called compartmentalization, and what compartmentalization allows a person to do is isolate and detach the different areas of their life that contradict or conflict with one another. So, for example, the person who curses like a sailor during the week at work and then talks like an angel on Sunday has most likely compartmentalized their work identity from their church identity. In the same way, the person who confesses their dependence on Christ in their personal prayers or devotion, yet never lets the light of Christ shine when they're around their friends or family most likely has employed some form of compartmentalization.

Compartmentalization becomes important for us at St. Paul's because it is a tool of the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh to keep God's people from being *unified* in their calling as baptized disciples of Christ. Christ is the head of the Church, the body of Christ, and when the body disconnects their actions from the head, the consequences are noticeable in the body. In our context at St. Paul's, this disconnection takes on two characteristics. First, God's people minimize the radical claim Christ makes on their life when He calls them to faith. This manifests itself when people place other competing sources of their identity on the same level as their baptismal identity (i.e., their identity as a sports fan demands more allegiance and loyalty then their identity as a redeemed sinner or their identity as a worker, entrepreneur, hunter, farmer, a person in good physical shape, etc.). Second, God's people begin to see serving as a burden rather than an opportunity.

These two characteristics that reveal a lack of unity in Christ are related both to the work of Jesus and to one another. When a person can compartmentalize their time, talent, and treasures from Christ, they inevitably see Christ's saving work as less and less important. Put another way, when every area of our life is under the Lordship of Jesus and the Father's authority, we become thoroughly aware of our sin and our need for Jesus. Once that connection between Christ's call from death to life and darkness to light is reengaged, the unity and service follows. Rather than viewing our lives as ones of limited resources for the advancement of our own perseverance, we see everything as gift from God since we have received the greatest gift, the forgiveness, life, and salvation of Christ. Being called by Christ becomes a wonderful privilege instead of a burden, and the day-to-day obligations of our vocations, including those in the church, become opportunities to serve instead of annoyances to be overcome.

Only God's Word through the work of the Holy Spirit can break down the compartmentalization that infects the modern world and the saints at St. Paul's, including myself. Because of this, the more people have contact with God's Word, the healthier and more mature God's people become. God's Word makes claim to the entire person to show the folly of hope outside of Him and then to provide that same hope in abundance through the comprehensive life-giving salvation of Jesus.

(29 families and 32 children to be exact!)






