Little Children tell the Christmas Story




The Preschool had our Christmas Program in front of a large crowd of parents, grandparents, friends, and church members. The Children sang songs while scripture was read leading us

We have been blessed with the task of sharing the Gospel to the next generation and it has been my sincere blessing and privilege to do this at the Lighthouse Preschool for the past 3.5 years. This letter is to inform you that after much thought and prayer I will be stepping down from my position as Director for the Lighthouse Preschool. I plan to transition out of my responsibilities by the end of January.

There are a few reasons for this decision. The main one is that it has been very difficult for me to balance life with a new baby and continuing to work. Another is that our family is enjoying homeschooling, which is also difficult to balance with the daily duties of directing a preschool. Both of these things were completely unforeseen a couple years ago when we transitioned the director position to a part time position. That arrangement was one that I saw being suitable for a very long time, but as mentioned before, we never could have imagined COVID or a new baby at that time! On top of these reasons, there is also the fact that the Lord is working through His word and sacraments in my husband's congregations. Because he is the sole pastor of both congregations, the increase of work, albeit exciting work, is falling solely on His shoulders. I am needed on the home front more than before.

As per the new by-laws, I have arranged for the interim director position to be filled by Jenelle Siebert. She is the person next to me that knows the most about the everyday working of the preschool and will do very well to keep everything afloat until a permanent decision for director can be made.



I will be available after this date by phone, text, in person meetings, and email to help assist in any way I can. I plan to offer my help in planning/executing the Spring Silent Auction and to attend the first Schoolboard meeting in the new structure on Feb. 3rd with Jenelle.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time at the preschool. The children are a blessing, the families and employees are wonderful, and the congregation is incredibly loving and gracious. I have especially enjoyed helping the preschool become more stable organizationally and financially, which will set it up to continue for many more years. We were beginning to look into the next steps of deciding how to diversify or better equip our facility to continue doing what we are doing for more children. I am sad to miss these exciting conversations but will be supporting and rooting on the church and preschool the entire time!

I will continue to pray for the preschool and the members at St. Paul's Lutheran Church and give thanks that Aberdeen is still a smallish town where I am likely to bump into many of you in the course of a day.
