God's Children and Not Snobs

Psalm 87:5-6, "And of Zion it shall be said, "This one and that one were born in her"; for the Most High himself will establish her. The LORD records as he registers the peoples, "This one was born there."

Logical fallacies are argumentative errors people use when trying to persuade others. One such fallacy is entitled the "Snob Appeal," and this fallacy is meant to distract the person from the relevant issues by creating a desire to feel special and unique. For example, marketers for a wine company would be employing this fallacy if they were to say, "Only people with distinguished and discerning tastes drink Silver Leaf Wine."

If you pay attention, you'll find these kinds of snob appeals are successfully made all around us on a regular basis, and the reason they're made is because they work. We are quite eager to distinguish ourselves from others based on an assumption of superiority, so we'll proudly don John Deere hats, Under Armour shirts, Browning hunting jackets, or Lululemon

tights.

We do this, too, when it comes to where we live. Growing up in a small town, I quickly learned that people who were born and raised in the community had a greater status and reputation that others who moved in. We do this in churches as well, as though those who are new members must go through an initiation process before they're acceptable for

leadership or service.

In Psalm 87, the Psalmist taking the status and importance associated with being born to the family and in the right community and turning into the Good News of God's promises ultimately fulfilled in Christ. The only people with a future hope are those who belong to God and can dwell in His presence. You and I can only do this through God making us acceptable to Him, that is through God making us members of His family, His community. In Baptism that's what He's done for us. He's made it so that regardless of where you were born or to whom you were born, you are now citizens of His kingdom and heirs of His Gospel treasures. It's just like Jesus says to Nicodemus in John 3:5, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God."

But status under Christ is different than the desired status we seek through our susceptibility to the snob appeal. Status under Christ is the status of humility and repentance that necessarily flows from the gift of free forgiveness. This status testifies to the work of Christ on our behalf and results not in a feeling of superiority but an eagerness to bring others into the peace, joy, and freedom of God's kingdom. You are citizens of Zion because of Jesus, and this removes the need for us to feel superiority over others. Instead, we can be who God wants us to be; we can be those who are called by Christ to serve.






We also went on a field trip to the dentist! We saw many cool (and gross) things. We learned why brushing our teeth and having good dental health is so important.
