#### Gospel Stewardship

#### 2 Corinthians 5:17-21:

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.

<sup>18</sup> All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation;<sup>19</sup> that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

<sup>20</sup> Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. <sup>21</sup> For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

These verses from St. Paul highlight one of the biggest misunderstandings surrounding our Christian identity, the question of *why* we are here. We might respond to the question "Why are we here?" with the answer "to satisfy our own desires." Yet, James 1:14-15 tells us no. To the contrary, it's our desires that lead us to sin by making us think we are God and in control. It was Eve's desire to be wise which the devil exploited in the Garden.

Then why are we here? Originally, we know we were created in God's image to be stewards of His creation. We see this very clearly, for example, in Genesis 1:26-28. Our fulfillment as human creatures came from trusting in God and doing the work of caring for His creation. The first sin, however, made this fulfillment impossible. Now instead of taking care of God's creation according to His will and design, we use it as an opportunity to assert ourselves and our desires over God's gifts, so now what? This is where St. Paul from the above passage comes in.

God, in Christ, has made us a new creation (2 Cor. 5:17) through the sacrifice and resurrection of His Son. Our Savior has reconciled us to our Creator, and this brings us through the grave so that we are no longer part of the old creation with its sin and death, but we look forward to the new heavens and new earth we see through faith in the Gospel, the good news that God has kept His promises and given us new life through the reconciliation of Jesus' cross.

This, then, makes the Gospel the *absolute* and *essential* key to our existence and the existence of the church. You cannot therefore, as a Christian, be a good steward of anything in your life until you are a good steward of the Gospel. Why? Because you, as a member of St. Paul's and as child of God in His kingdom, have been entrusted with "the message of reconciliation" (2 Cor. 5:19).

All the questions we might ask ourselves about good stewardship with respect to money or land apply first and foremost to the Gospel. Being daily in God's Word is part of your God given stewardship of the Gospel. Have you been a good steward of the Gospel within your family? Do you say daily devotions, pray together, forgive one another in the stead of Christ? Do you bring the Gospel to bear on issues at work, in your extended family, or with your friends? These things, and much more, we should be doing if we are to be good stewards of the Gospel, and not only that, but God has called us to this stewardship by virtue of our Baptism. St. Peter says you are a "holy priesthood" (1 Peter 2:5) through your faith in Christ, which means you have the authority and command to use God's Gospel gifts in every aspect of your life.

Being a steward of the Gospel is not a duty left to the pastor or called workers of St. Paul's. It's a duty given chiefly and above all to the body of Christ, and that body is you. Just as financial health can be traced back to good or poor stewardship, so too can spiritual health. It is the primary role of the church to make sure that the faith and the biblical doctrines of the church are passed on to the next generation and shared with all those who need to hear it within this community. If this is not happening, it's because there's a breakdown in stewardship, stewardship of the Gospel.




