A Season of Change

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ² a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; ³ a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ⁴ a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ⁵ a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶ a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away; ⁷ a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; ⁸ a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace." (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8)

Fall is a time of change. As we enter October the leaves begin to change, the weather begins to get colder, and children are starting new grades, sports, and new chapters in their life. Fall is a season of change and change happens whether we want it to or not. Your kids grow up and leave the house, you begin to lose a step, maybe you begin to consider retirement, or maybe you are getting ready to move either permanently or for the winter. Fall is simply a time of change.

That is why this passage from Ecclesiastes is powerful because it reminds us that there is a time for everything in this life, even for the things we do not want to think about. There are even times to weep, to mourn, to die, to lose, and everything else. There is a time or season for every matter under heaven and what great comfort this should give us! Even as you face change that you do not want to think about or even as you face change that is bitter-sweet you are reminded that God is in control of all things! God is not explicitly mentioned anywhere in this passage, but he does not have to be. For we know as God's children that he is in control of all things. That he is with us every step of our lives and with us through every change in our lives, whether good or bad.

And what great comfort this passage gives us because it allows us to simply be human as God created us to be. I cannot count how many times people have said, "I know we shouldn't mourn or cry" at funerals and I completely disagree! Christ cried at the tomb of Lazarus and as Ecclesiastes tells us, "A time to mourn" and "a time to weep." We should mourn and weep when the situation calls for it. Just like how we should celebrate and dance when the situation calls for it. These verses remind us what it means to be human. It means first and foremost to realize that we are not in control. Just like we have no control over the seasons, but to realize God is and that he is with us every step of the way. It also reminds us that God has given us the capacity to weep, to rejoice, to mourn, and to dance and so we do because that is how God created us and what it means to be human according to God's Word.

So, as you go through changes in this life never forget this passage. It might be a time to seek, or a time to dance, or a time to mourn and that is okay! For there is a time and place for all things under heaven. However, never forget that God is with you through all the good, the bad, and even the ugly. For he created you and loves you so much he sent his Son down to die for you. Yes, there was even a time for his Son to die for you. Thanks be to God for that! Amen. In Christ,

Called to Serve



Jesus Door-2-Door went canvassing in Aberdeen, SD on September 17, 2022!

We had 13 people representing 2 LCMS congregations go canvassing in Aberdeen, SD. We knocked on 135 homes. 64 people answered the door, and of those, 37 took our survey. We left gospel and congregational literature at the 71 houses where no one was home. When we asked, "Are you familiar with St. Paul's Lutheran Church?" 24% answered "No." When we asked, "Do you currently go to church?" 22% answered "No."

When we asked, "Where do you believe you will go when you die?" 33 said "heaven" but only 13 of those believed they would get there on account of the work of Jesus Christ. 1 said, "I don't know." And 3 did not answer the question. Through our canvassing efforts, we discovered 1 individual who desired a follow-up conversation about our congregation and the gospel of Jesus Christ. To God alone be the Glory.
