 - i. National level
 - ii. Family level
 - iii. Proverbs 14:34

 - a. They were **not** military commanders, governors, authorities instituted by God, chosen by the heads of the nation
 - b. They were called by God out of the midst of their brethren to be delivers of the state
 - i. Either through the Holy Spirit or through prophets and extraordinary manifestations of God

 - b. Revelation 7:4
