A Season of Reversals

Luke 2:46-55

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, ⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, ⁴⁸ for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹ for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. ⁵⁰ And his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. ⁵¹ He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; ⁵² he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate; ⁵³ he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. ⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, ⁵⁵ as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his offspring forever."

Advent is a time of preparation and waiting. We wait and prepare not for the baby Jesus, though we do celebrate his coming, but for Christ's second coming. That is why it is fitting, as we wait and prepare, to look at Mary's Magnificat. This is the song Mary sang while visiting her cousin Elizabeth due to the joy they are receiving from God.

However, one of the most striking features of Mary's Magnificat are the reversals that can be seen throughout it. Take verse 52 "he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate". It is hard not to see the reversals here. The humble are usually seen in lowly way, while the mighty are up high. But notice what Mary does, she notes that God does the exact opposite. He brings up the humble and brings down the mighty. A complete reversal!

That is one of the reasons why it is fitting so say that Advent is a season of reversals. How we usually think of the world is thrown on its head. Here comes a king, but he is not born in a castle, or with servants all around him, or even dressed in royal garments. No, here is a king born in a stable who is laid in a manger and surrounded by shepherds of all people! The weirdest part, however, is not where he was born or to whom he was born, but what he has come to do. No, one who is born comes into the world saying, "I am here to die for you". That's just foolishness, but that is exactly what this baby has come to do. He has come to die not just for the people who love him, not just for the Jews, but for all people. He has come to die for sake of his creation.

This is the king that has come down and has died for you. Not because of good or mighty you are but because you are part of his creation that he loves so much. So much so that he sent his only son to die for you. So, as you wait and prepare for the second coming of this king remember this is the king that reverses everything, we think we know about the world. He brings down the proud and elevates the humble. However, above all else remember this is the king that will do anything to be with you forever. That is his love for you! That is a true Christmas miracle!

Merry Christmas!


