Elijah and the Prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:20-40)

First Principles:

- 1. The event involving Elijah and the Prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel points to the birth and life of Jesus.
- 2. When interpreting an allegory, one must remember to interpret in the right direction (the antitype → the type → you).
- 3. Christ is the key to interpreting Scripture. All things in the Old Testament point forward to the cross. All things in the New Testament point back to the cross.
