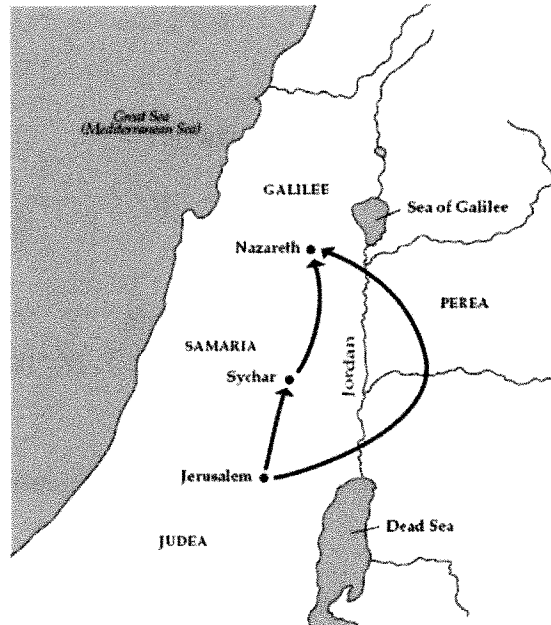


## Women at the Well
