The Hope of the Resurrection

1 Peter 3:15b: always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect.

For so many people when you talk to them about sharing their faith with others, they get flustered. They know what they believe but to share that with others can be intimidating and scary. What if I say the wrong thing? What will the person think about me? What happens if I just don't know what to say? Questions like this flash through us as we think about worse case scenarios, but here's the dirty little secret. Sharing your faith with others is not that scary or even hard to do! I am not saying this because I am a pastor but because the Bible and Peter tells us simply what to say.

Look at what Peter says in 1 Peter 3:15. We need to be prepared to make a defense, or in other words, to share with others what we believe. However, Peter also tells us what we need to share with them. We need to share with them the hope that is in us.

Now before we continue it should be noted that Biblical hope. The hope Peter is talking about here is different than worldly hope. Worldly hope is simply wishful thinking. For example, "I hope my sports team wins this game". That is wishful thinking. However, Biblical hope is the assurance and the certainty of what is already ours. So, if that is the case what is the hope that Peter is talking about here? It is the hope of the resurrection. The hope of life everlasting. Or another way of putting it. It is the certainty of the resurrection and of life everlasting because of what our God has done for us!

That is what we share with others. We simply share with them the hope that is in us because of our God. We share with them what our God has done for us. That He sent His only begotten son to become part of His creation. So that he would carry all of our sins to the cross and die the death we deserve, but more than that, that he would rise three days later and conquer all of our enemies! Now we have life everlasting all because of what our God has done for us, because of his love for His creation and for you and me.

That's the Gospel! That's the wonderful news of what our God has done not just for us, but for all people. That is the wonderful news we get to share to proclaim to all who will listen. And we don't need to do this with eloquent speech or anything like that. We simply tell them about the Gospel, about what our God has done for us through Jesus. It really is that simple and the wonderful thing is that you are never alone. For the Holy Spirit is with you and he will give you the words to say and even if you think afterwards, "I should have said this!". Be comforted knowing that the Holy Spirit is working through us even if we don't say everything, we think we should have. Simply proclaim the Gospel and leave the rest to God. He knows what He is doing far better than us. May God help us to proclaim the hope that is in us.



All good things must come to an end...


