Immanuel- God With Us

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. (Isaiah 7:14)

One of the difficulties on knowing some of the Christmas prophecies so well is that we lose how amazing and special they are. I mean printed above is one of Isaiah's famous prophecies that we hear every single year at Christmas. Yet, we don't often think twice about it besides to move straight to Jesus laying in a manager, and in some ways that is perfectly normal and fine to do. However, notice that when we do that, we lose an important aspect of the prophecy, namely, how God works.

When we pause to simply reflect and chew on this verse without moving straight to Christmas, we begin to see that God works in mysterious ways. First, a virgin is going to conceive! That in and of itself is miraculous and dare I say scandalous. We all know how quickly word spreads even without modern technology and you would know that a virgin conceiving would be newsworthy. Without a doubt everyone would be talking about it and would be talking about her.

So, then, why would God work this way? Why would he work through a virgin that would have to escape scrutiny or even move away?

First, as a reminder to us his creation, that his way is not our way. This is so important to remember time and time again because we either think that we have God figured out or we think we know what he should be doing and thus think that we know better than him. Yet here he is reminding us that how he works is by far different than we could ever imagine. That he is going to send down his son to be born of a virgin and not to a virgin who is mighty in stature, power, or wealth but instead to a virgin who is humble, faithful, and God fearing. We would never expect God to work in this way for that is not the way of the world. Yet, this is exactly how he works, and it is a reminder that God knows better than we do and that we should simply trust in him.

This Christmas and Advent season simply rest in that simple truth that God works in mysterious ways. He worked through a humble virgin to bring about his plan of salvation and what a wonderful blessing that is for us as his people! So, even if we do not always understand why God does what he does go back to what we do understand and that is what we see at Christmas. We see his love for us by sending down his son to be born of a virgin all so that one day he would hang on a cross to die for you. All so that he could take the punishment we deserve and put it on his son. Rest in that reality and that truth. That even during hard times like Christmas as you mourn a loved one not being there remember that God is with us and that because of his son our tears of sorrow will soon turn to tears of joy because of this baby who has come for you and me.

May God bless you this Christmas and Advent season by turning our focus off the things of this world and onto his son who died and rose for us so that we can be with him forever!

#### Merry Christmas!


