Dear Members of St Paul's Lutheran,

What a joy as we approach Easter and the Resurrection of our Lord. I am amazed how every year my love for Jesus grows deeper and his sacrifice and resurrection means more to me than it did before. Having children makes you grateful for the forgiveness not only offered to you but to your loved ones. God is indeed gracious that he gave up His only Son to die that we might live. And not just our generation or the one that came before it but the generations that will come after us. Imagine it, Easter 2125 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, they will still be preaching Jesus risen from the dead just as we are just as our ancestors on the prairie and the ones who traveled from Europe and beyond. We are tied into thousands of years of church history, tens of thousands of years of Biblical history, we are just the next page and there will be many pages after us. Thanks be to God.

I would like to address a few questions I have received in the past few weeks. First, I consume all of the communion wine in the chalice. I had been asked why and I would like to give the congregation some information. First, the simple answer is that Christ tells us in the scriptures to take and "eat" not take and store or take and pour out somewhere else. Whereas pouring out the chalice on the ground is the second best choice, I like to be biblical and follow Christ's command. Where he says to take and drink and take and eat we will endeavor to do this. We will do our best to make sure these counts and preparation are as close as they can be so there is little "extra." Second, in the wake of Covid, I took to this practice to make sure that people knew that the wine in the chalice was not "reused" at a later service. Now those immediate concerns have gone away and yet a measure of peace is given I think that the wine for each service is consumed and not used again. Third, OUR LCMS Altar Guild Manual which is seen as a worship manual or sorts give us clear instruction that the preferred practice is to consume the wine in the chalice. This is in keeping with church history. Up until the time where the common cup fell out of practice in most Lutheran churches it was common for the pastor to consume what was left. This is not a "Catholic" but rather a "catholic" practice or a practice of the historic church. In the time of Luther it would have been commonplace to consume the elements and I would say, who is more "lutheran" than Luther. On a personal level, I have endeavored to treat the sacramental elements with care and high respect. The wine and the bread, Christ's Body and Blood are precious to me and I see this as the highest level of respect that when Christ tells us to eat and to drink that is what we do.

ON a different note, I thought I might add a bit of explanation. When I am not preaching but offering the sacrament I wear the chasuble. St Paul's has a chasuble for every church season and it is something I have always wanted to utilize but never have. The chasuble is meant to signify that the wearer is the celebrant. The celebrant is the pastor who is in charge of leading the sacrament section of the service. Now, we adorn the celebrant not to make the person special but rather to mark that the sacrament is special. We rejoice! WE sing special music in the sacramental liturgy and we wear special clothing to communicate that something very special is happening. I choose to wear it for three reasons then. To accentuate the theology mentioned above. To add a bit of color to the church service! And to feel close to the historic church where wearing a chasuble was commonplace as well.

I hope those theological explanations help in your worship at St Paul's. If you wish to speak more about these issues please let me know.

Lent and Kids




You don't talk to kids about sad things like death and sin, do you?
