Mark 1:29-2:12

- 1. It was a great fever
- 2. Rising to pray by darkness another sign of "messianic secret" which will no longer be a secret after 8:31
- 3. Jesus only prays three times in Mark
 - a. Here, 6:46 after the feeding of the 5000, and in the Garden of Gethsemane
- 4. Preaching vs teaching 35-39
- 5. The Leper
 - a. Jesus has the ability to cure the underlying problem this isn't a ritual cleansing
 - b. The way health was perceived, this was power over life and death.

2:1-12

- 1. "your sins are actually/right now truly being forgiven"
 - a. The forgiveness is happening as Jesus is speaking
- 2. Notice the scribes are sitting.
- 3. Jesus is able to see into their hearts (a clear example of Jesus' divinity).
- 4. So, which one is easier: to say your sins are forgiven or rise pick up your mat and walk?
- 5. How do we see the kingdom of God coming to these people?
- 6. Mark uses the phrase "Son of Man" 14 times in the Gospel.
 - a. Ps 8:4-6
 - i. Heb 2:5-9
 - b. Dan 7:13-14

13-17

- 1. This flipping between teaching and preaching.
- 2. We see again by a simple command Jesus calls his disciples.
- 3. Table fellowship
- 4. Difference between John the Baptist and Jesus
 - a. John functions in the wilderness; Jesus functions in cities and villages
 - b. John eats locusts and wild honey; Jesus eats and drinks as at a feast
 - c. John (probably) abstains from alcohol; Jesus does not
- 5. Jesus does not abstain from the good gifts of God's creation but participates in them.
- 6. Verse 17 is both the crux of the Gospel and an accusation at the Pharisees.
