

The Passion in the Gospel of Mark

During the Season of Lent

First Sunday of Lent: February 22

Mark 14:1-21

Here we see the battle lines begin to be drawn. This section is filled with people who are both for and against Jesus. Who will listen to him? Who will follow him? Who will betray him?

Second Sunday of Lent: March 1st

Mark 14:22-42

The disciples last moments with Jesus. A Passover meal. True teaching. A night of prayer. Their fellowship has not been broken...yet.

Third Sunday of Lent: March 8th

Mark 14:43-72

The denial begins. First the disciples run from Jesus in the Garden. Then Peter denies the Lord. The disciples deny the Lord, but he will not deny his mission.

Fourth Sunday of Lent: March 15th

Mark 15:1-20

What we see here is a battle between the authority of the world and true authority. Jesus is led between worldly authorities who think they have the power to kill or save him when they don't even know what battle they are actually part of.

Fifth Sunday of Lent: March 22nd

Mark 15:21-47

And so we come to the end. Jesus is crucified. Jesus dies and he is taken down from the cross and buried. We will study these lessons not for the emotional but for knowledge and understanding.
