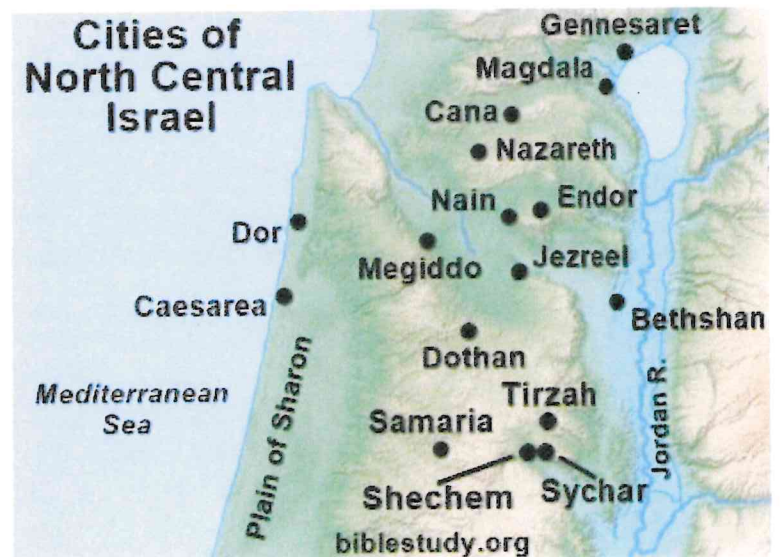
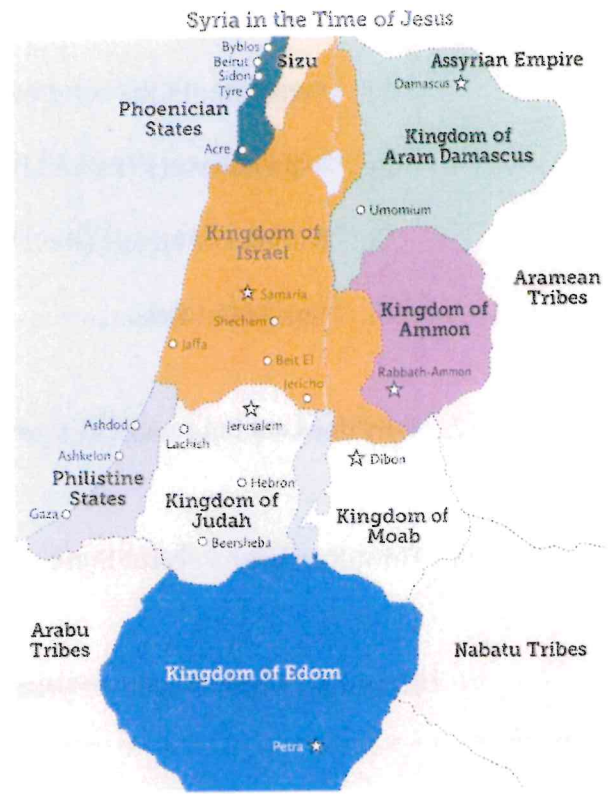


Horses and Chariots of Fire

 - g. Genesis 2:1
6. Angels:
 - a. Means "messenger"
 - b. Act as intermediaries: Galatians 3:19; Rev. 1:1
 - c. Serve in God's court



- d. Make up God's army: Passover, Is. 37:36
- e. Cherubim: guard God's throne along with being attendants (Ez. 10:1-22; 4-28; Genesis 3:24; on the ark of the covenant and the curtains of the Tabernacle)
- f. Seraphim: in the court or temple of God. Only in Isaiah 6:2-6
- g. Help believers (Ps 91:11-12; Acts 12:7; Hebrews 1:14)
- h. Number of angels (Rev. 5:11; 12:4)
- i. Spirits but flesh
